

The West Virginia Achieves Report Card is a legislatively mandated publication of a school's progress. The sections in this Report Card are School Accountability, Statewide Testing, Teacher Information (including quality), other school indicators and definitions. Under "Accountability" the checkmarks "\" represent a passing status regarding Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP). The "X" represents needs improvement for standards indicated. A blank space indicates the school is not required to meet AYP because the number of students reporting is less than 50. Elementary and Middle schools are required to use Attendance Rate (greater than 95 percent for AYP) and high schools are required to use Graduation Rate (greater than 80 Percent).

Accountability for Testing Results.

Includes results for students enrolled for a full academic year, 5th instructional day through the testing date, in grades 3 through 8 and grade 11.

Advance Placement in High School Courses.

Percentage of tenth, eleventh, and twelfth grade public school students who were enrolled in at least one advanced placement course which uses curriculum designed to prepare the student for taking College Board Advanced Placement Tests

Advanced Placement Test (APT).

Percentage of students who took at least one Advanced Placement Test given by the College Board, and scored 3 or better.

American College Testing (ACT).

Percentage of graduates who took the ACT exam. The Composite Score is given when five or more students took the test.

Attendance Rate.

Percentage of elementary and middle school students who were reported as being present at school (Formula: Total days present divided by the sum of total days present and total days absent.)

Average Class Size.

Average number of students (grades 1-12) in a "regular education" classroom receiving instruction in English Language Arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.

AYP (Adequate Yearly Progress).

Meeting, or significant progress toward, the WV Achieves accountability standards.

Discipline Standard.

The number of the serious discipline offenses is less than 5% of the second month enrollment for the school.

Dropout Rate

Percentage of students in grades 7-12 who left school, for any reason except death, before graduation or without transferring to another school. (Formula: Number of dropouts divided by enrollment.)

Economically Disadvantage (Low SES.

Students who are eligible for free and reduced lunch through the National School Lunch Program.

Graduation Rate.

Beginning in School Year (SY) 2010–2011, states are required to report a uniform, comparable, and accurate graduation rate known as a "four-year adjusted cohort rate," which measures the percent of students in a ninth grade cohort that graduate with a regular diploma in four years or less. This rate also must be used for determining Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) beginning in SY 2011–2012. The regulations require states to report and use a "four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate" based on the following formula: # of first-time 9th graders in fall plus students who transfer in, minus students who transfer out, emigrate, or die during school years divided by the # of cohort members who earned a regular high school diploma by the end of the school year. The Graduation Cohort rate is lagged one year.

Limited English Proficiency (LEP).

A student whose native language is a language other than English; OR whose language environment has had a significant impact on the individual's level of English language proficiency.

Migrant.

A child is considered migrant whose parent or spouse is a migratory agricultural worker, who seeks to obtain temporary or seasonal employment in agriculture, and who has moved from one school to another within the district/state in the preceding 36 months.

NAEP.

A national assessment given to a sample of state students. Only state results are available. months.

Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT).

Percentages of sophomores and juniors who took the PSAT.

Professional Staff-Average Years of Experience.

Average number of years of experience for professional staff derived by dividing the sum of all years experience by the number of professional staff.

Pupil/Administrator and Pupil/Teacher Ratio.

Average number of students for administrators and teachers.

Statewide Testing.

WESTEST2 is a new (2009) test of the more rigorous standards put into the curriculum. The tests were administered to students in grades 3 through 11. The test measures the proficiency level of students in mathematics, reading/language arts, science and social studies. Test results reported in this document reflect the percent of students in the school in each of the proficiency categories. Students scoring mastery, above mastery and distinguished are considered proficient for the purpose of the NCLB determinations for the school, county and state.

Students with Disabilities

Students with disabilities are students who meet eligibility criteria for one or more of the disabilities defined in Policy 2419: Regulations for the Education of Students with Exceptionalities and need special education. The disabilities are as follows: autism, blindness and low vision, deafblindness, deafness, developmental delay, emotional/behavioral disorder, hard of hearing, mental impairment, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, specific learning disability, speech/language impairment and traumatic brain injury.

Student Enrollment.

The number of students enrolled at the end of the second school month. The number includes pre-kindergarten through grade 12.
